About the College:

About the Competition:

Surendranath Law College had organized an intra college moot court competition titled Bijan Kumar Mukherjee Intra College Moot Competition on January 22, 2020. A moot court is like simulating a real court, where students are made to participate in the staged court proceedings that are related to a fictional dispute between parties. Participants were given a Mock Case in dispute where they had to participate from both sides, namely Petitioners and Respondents, in turns. The students prepared the written memorials which are sets of pleadings on behalf of all the parties to the dispute. All the teams were required to prepare both the sides.

The faculty coordinators of the moot court society, namely Prof. Dr. Mohammadi Tarannum, Prof. Dr. Rajarshi Das, Prof. MD Ammar Zaki, Prof. Shibasish Banerjee, along with other student coordinators, helped prepare for the competition, which ultimately was a huge success.

Outcome of the Competition:

Mooting is very essential for a law student. The benefits of participating in a moot court competition can never be out numbered. The teams learnt professional tactics from dressing to professionally tackling the matter in dispute. By the end of their mooting journey their skills and legal knowledge was fully boosted and enhanced as they had to go through several books of law, citing cases, commentaries, sections and landmark judgments. The competition helped the participants to gain knowledge regarding the functioning of a court and how trials and pleadings take place.

The competition also helped them improve their research and writing skills. Not to mention about their development in social and communicative skills, students who were declared award winners were able to intern with reputed advocates and law firms throughout the city.
