

Moot Court Workshop by MD. AMMAR ZAKI

DATE - 18th August, 2022.

SPEAKER- MD Ammar Zaki, Renowned Advocate at High Court of Calcutta.

TOPIC -

Surendranath Law College, under University of Calcutta is among the oldest esteemed law colleges of India. Our "Rastraguru" Surendranath Banerjee founded this college at the heart of the city and near Sealdah Station, to encourage more students to partake in higher education in law and be legal reformers and reformers of the community.

This Surendranath Law College on 18th August, 2022 organized a **One day Moot Court Workshop to help the students be a better mooter and be better legal professionals of the nation.**

But, what is Moot Court?

Moot Court is a model Courtroom, where the law students participate as the Advocates, one from Plaintiff side another from Defendant side and they debate respectively, putting forward their Arguments and Rebuttals.

A moot court competition simulates a court hearing (usually an appeal against a final decision), in which participants analyse a problem, research the relevant law, prepare written submissions, and present oral argument. Moot problems are typically set in areas of law that are unsettled or that have been subject to recent developments. They usually involve two grounds of appeal, argued by each side.

Mooting is not the same as public speaking or debating, although it shares some common elements with these activities. It is a specialised application of the art of persuasive advocacy. It has been part of the process of training lawyers for centuries and plays an important role in legal education, not only in India, but also throughout the world.

MD Ammar Zaki, being a renowned Advocate at Calcutta High Court took out time from his busy schedule to enlighten the students by giving them a lecture at the workshop.

He said Mooting is something that enhances an individual's legal researching, drafting and oratory skills. He highlighted the importance behind the participation at the Moot Court Competition. He stated why every law student should participate in as many moot court competitions as possible as it holds following advantages-

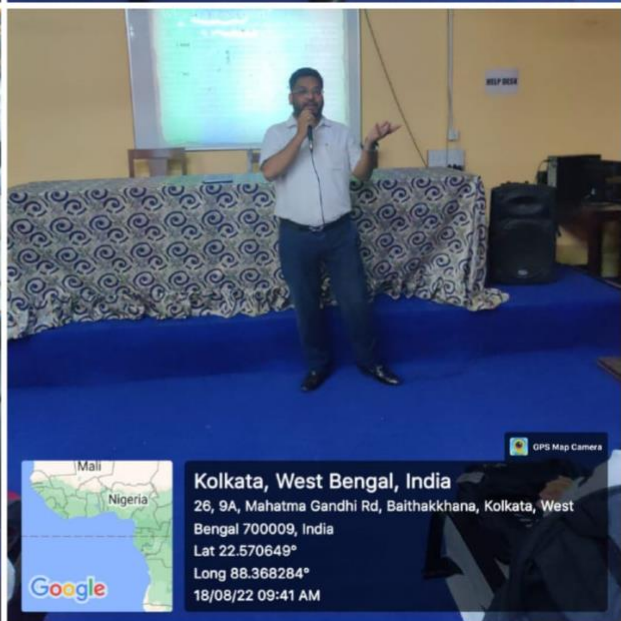
1. Mooting enables students to engage with and think deeply about interesting and topical legal issues;
2. Mooting enhance the advocacy, legal research and writing skills;
3. Mooting enables the students to learn team work by closely working with their peers; and
4. Also to demonstrate their interest in advocacy and competence as an advocate to prospective employers. Most students find mooting to be intellectually rewarding and highly enjoyable. It can be nerve-racking and frustrating but it is a lot of fun.
5. Mooting can help in fostering one's orator skills and reduce their fear of performance, at the time of 1st time appearing at the court.

The Speaker also provided a detailed illustration on the drafting pattern of a Moot Memorial. He stated that He also emphasized on time management, modulation and how to greet the bench. The speaker also had an amazing special interactive session in the end, with the students, answering all their inquiries regarding Moot Court.

OUTCOME –

It will not be wrong to say that this Moot Court Workshop was a tremendous success. The Students got to know about important and new facts about mooting which will not only help them in their career but be a better Lawyer in Future. This moot court workshop also encouraged the law students to participate in more moot court competition, both nationals and internationals.
