**About College:**

Surendranath Law College, Kolkata is a premier law institute in India which is affiliated to the University of Calcutta and recognized by the Bar Council of India. It is one of the oldest law colleges in India. The 'Rastraguru' Surendranath Banerjea, the great patriot and educationalist found this prestigious institution. In 1882, the Presidency School, which formed the nucleus of the present Institution, was handed over to Sir Surendranath Banerjea on 1st January 1884. He raised it to the status of a college affiliated to the F.A. standard and named it "The Presidency Institution". Within a year the institution was converted into a full fledged, first grade college under the name "Ripon College". Its activity was further extended through the opening of the Post-Graduate Department of Law in 1884, which was later affiliated to the Calcutta University in the year 1885, as an independent professional college. But after the attainment of independence, the golden cause to which Sir Surendranath dedicated his entire life, the name of the college was altered to Surendranath College. This esteemed Law College is now regarded as one of the oldest law colleges of the country. Presently, this College imparts 5 Years B.A. LL.B course, 5 Years B.A. LL.B (Honours) Course and two Years LL.M Course.

**About the course:**

The 30-Hour Online Certificate Course (Value added course) on "Criminology and Victimology" is an initiative of Surendranath Law College, Kolkata, aimed at broadening the horizons of students, researchers, and professionals in the fields of law, criminal justice, and social sciences. Scheduled from 1<sup>st</sup> June 2025 to 15<sup>th</sup> June 2025, the programme is designed to provide an in-depth understanding of the causes of crime, criminal behaviour, and the rights, needs, and protection of victims within the justice system.

This intensive course will be conducted entirely online, allowing participants from across the country to benefit from expert-led lectures, interactive sessions, and case-based discussions. It will cover both theoretical frameworks and practical perspectives, ensuring participants gain a holistic grasp of the subject matter.

Topics will range from classical and contemporary criminological theories to victimology's evolving role in shaping criminal justice policies. The course will also

explore victim rights legislations, restorative justice mechanisms, and the socio-psychological dimensions of crime and victimhood.

By the end of the programme, participants will not only have enhanced their academic and professional competence but will also receive a Certificate of Completion, making this course an enriching addition to their academic credentials.

#### **Objective of the Course:**

This course is built on common foundation of Criminology & Criminal Justice and allows for maximum flexibility to meet the needs of the participants and their respective area of interest. In this approach, the course will be individualized to meet the participant's professional goals in keeping with the overall objectives of the programme. Panda**, Associate Professor (Law), Xavier Law School, XIM University as resource persons and speakers. Candidates who secured Regular Attendance and submitted the feedback forms and completed the Module based Assignments got the participation certificate at the end of the course.
