## **ABOUT THE SEMINAR**

The demographic shift in India predicts a significant increase in the elderly population due to declining fertility rates and improved healthcare, with estimates suggesting that by 2050, 19.1% of the population will be above 60 years old. This demographic change brings forth various age-related health challenges such as memory loss, cognitive decline, and arthritis.

To address the concerns of the aging population, the Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act, 2007 (MWPSA Act, 2007) was enacted. This legislation obliges children or legal heirs to provide financial security and care for elderly parents, backed by Maintenance

Tribunals at the district level. Additionally, voluntary societies registered under the Societies Registration Act of 1860 assist elderly citizens in filing complaints at these tribunals.

The MWPC Act also emphasizes the role of the State in providing healthcare facilities, including medical assistance and old age homes, while safeguarding the property rights of the elderly. Failure to comply with the Act can result in legal consequences, such as imprisonment or fines for the children or legal heirs.

However, despite the provisions of the MWPC Act, certain loopholes exist. For instance, the Act primarily focuses on the obligation of children or legal heirs, leaving elderly individuals vulnerable to mistreatment by in-laws. Moreover, the maintenance allowance of Rs. 10,000 may be insufficient for elderly individuals requiring long-term palliative care. Cases have been reported of elderly individuals being abandoned or mistreated by their children, highlighting the need for stronger protection measures.

This seminar aims to address these loopholes and challenges faced by the elderly population in India. By engaging various stakeholders, including civic society, caregivers, medical experts, social workers, and youth, the seminar seeks to initiate a dialogue to improve the socio-legal framework and enhance the overall experience of aging in India. The ultimate goal is to formulate new policies that bridge the existing gaps and ensure the well-being and dignity of senior citizens in the country.

This seminar would address the existing loopholes in the MWPC Act (2007) and point out the challenges faced by the elderly population of the country by highlighting various instances. The aim of the seminar will be to initiate a multi-stakeholder conversation that will include civic society, caregivers, medical experts, social workers and youth in order to impart knowledge about the socio-legal framework that exists for the elderly people in India. The seminar will also pave the way for reformulating new policies by addressing the existing gaps and improving the overall experience of ageing in India.

## **OBJECTIVE OF THE SEMINAR**

1. To create awareness of a geriatric-friendly society and promote initiatives to sensitize the youth about the legal frameworks surrounding geriatric care and well-being.

## **PROGRAMME DETAILS:**

It was a sunny morning. The Extension Activities committee of Surendranath Law College and NSS Cell of Presidency University were observing “International Day of Older Persons”. Programme commenced with faculties, staffs, students and our invited dignified speakers.

### ***Hon’ble Justice Biswaroop Chowdhury, High Court Calcutta:***

After felicitation and introductory session, our Chief Guest Hon’ble Justice Biswaroop Chowdhury (High Court Calcutta) was given a thought provoking and resourceful information. This session had very much engaging discussions. He highlighted the significance of paying attention to protect their fundamental rights. Their **fundamental well-being is at grave risk**”, not least in the context of Russia’s war being waged in Ukraine, where older persons are facing a particularly appalling humanitarian situation. Thus, he provided valuable insights into the legal framework. He also discussed the MWPC Act 2007 in a comprehensible way.

### ***Dr. Arunkumar Maiti, Programme Advisor (Dean of Students, Presidency University):***

The way so eloquently he started this program won many of the students’ heart. He steered away from the typical introductory monologue, and mentioned some questions before all of us. Among them one very interesting and at the same time informative question was “exactly at what age people are considered to be elderly?”

According to “National Policy of Older Persons 1999” persons aged 60 years and above are considered elderly people. And he also gives some information about this particular policy to under understand our agenda of the seminar better.

### ***Prof. Sumita Saha, Chairperson Programme Coordinator, NSS Professor at Department of Sociology Presidency University :***

we are honoured to have her as a speaker in the seminar. Her approach towards MWPC ACT 2007 was analytical made a positive impact on the students. India is regarded as DEMOGRAPHIC DIVIDEND India is currently a young nation but the share of its elderly population is increasing and is expected to be 12% by 2050. But their rights were mostly neglected in this modern era. Indian traditional society with its concept of joint family system was a strong pillar in ensuring the security and wellbeing of the elderly. But modernization and globalization paved way for the birth of nuclear families. She also mentioned some loopholes of the MWPC Act 2007.

Overall her insightful presentation made everyone of us enlightened. There was also Q&A session with her which was interactive enough.

✚ *Dr. Mohammadi Tarannum , Chairperson (Vice Principal), Surendranath Law College :*

Dr. Mohammadi Tarannum gave a speech on how we should behave with older people. What things we can do for them by doing what things we can make them happy. She delivered a talk on fostering positive interactions with older adults. They discussed ways to show respect, offer support, and create opportunities for happiness through meaningful connections.

Mention the importance of "demonstrating patience" when interacting with older adults, who may move or think slower. That eventually make students feel the need to introspect their own behaviour.

✚ *S. Irudaya Rajan, Chairman, International Institute of Migration and Development*

We were truly privileged to welcome S. Irudaya Rajan as our speaker. He made us aware on the topic: "Impact of Migration of the Young on the Elderly Persons in Kerala." Kerala faces a unique situation with a high rate of young people migrating for work, both within India and abroad. This trend has significant consequences for the elderly population left behind.

❖ **Challenges for Elderly:**

- **Increased Dependency:** With fewer young adults around, the elderly become more dependent on others for daily tasks, healthcare assistance, and emotional support.
- **Social Isolation:** Migration can lead to social isolation for the elderly, especially those who live alone or have limited mobility.
- **Financial Strain:** While remittances from migrated family members can improve financial situations, there can be uncertainties in receiving them consistently.
- **Strain on Traditional Support Systems,** Traditional family structures where generations lived together are changing, putting pressure on formal care facilities which may be scarce.

*Policy and Societal Responses:*

- ✓ **Investment in Senior Care:** Increased government and private investment in senior care facilities, home care services, and social support programs for the elderly is crucial.
- ✓ **Community Support Networks:** Strengthening community support networks through local volunteers and NGOs can help address isolation and provide practical assistance to the elderly.

✚ *Prof. Arunangshu Talukdar, (Head of the Department of Geriatrics) Medical College, Kolkata :*

We're thrilled to have the incredible **Prof. Arunangshu Talukdar**, in the seminar. He gave a speech on the topic- "life expectancy and Dementia". He mentioned some common symptoms of dementia such as;

- ❖ **Memory loss:** This is often the most noticeable symptom, especially forgetting recent events or conversations.
- ❖ **Difficulty concentrating:** People with dementia may find it hard to focus on a task or follow a conversation.
- ❖ **Problems with reasoning and judgment:** This can manifest as difficulty making decisions, poor financial management, or neglecting personal hygiene.
- ❖ **Language problems:** People with dementia may struggle to find the right words, have trouble following conversations, or repeat themselves frequently.
- ❖ **Disorientation:** Confusion about time, place, and even identity can occur in later stages.
- ❖ **Personality changes:** Depression, anxiety, apathy, or unusual behaviour can be signs of dementia.

**As life expectancy rises, the number of people living with dementia is also likely to increase as in;**

- ❖ **Maintaining a healthy lifestyle** with a balanced diet, regular exercise, and mental stimulation can potentially reduce the risk of dementia, although not guaranteed.
- ❖ Engaging **in brain-stimulating activities** like puzzles, learning new skills, and social interaction may help keep cognitive function sharp.
- ❖ **Social Connection:** Social isolation is a risk factor for dementia. Staying connected with friends and family, and participating in social activities, is important.

*He assured us by saying that by* taking proactive steps and staying informed, individuals can approach the topic of life expectancy and dementia with a sense of empowerment and control.

✚ **Prof (Dr.) Kavita Singh, Professor of Law, Criminal Justice System, in WBNUJS Kolkata :**

We are honoured to have Prof. Kavita Singh as a speaker to make a distinction in our seminar. She gave a speech on the topic "Protection of Legal Rights of Elderly population in India, Welfare and Maintenance of parents and senior citizens Act, 2007". **The MWPC Act, 2007 is based on the vision of Article 41 of the Constitution.** India has a growing elderly population, and ensuring their well-being and legal rights is crucial. The Welfare and Maintenance of Parents and Senior Citizens Act, 2007 (MWPC Act) is a key piece of legislation that addresses this need.

**How the MWPC Act Helps:**

- **Maintenance Rights:** The Act guarantees the right of elderly parents and senior citizens (above 60 years old) to receive financial support from their children (including biological, adoptive, and stepchildren) or legal heirs.
- **Speedy and Inexpensive Justice:** The Act establishes a simple and inexpensive procedure for elderly individuals to claim monthly maintenance through designated Tribunals.
- **Protection of Property:** The Act safeguards the property rights of senior citizens by making certain transfers of property under pressure or undue influence void.
- ✓ **Loopholes of MWPC Act 2007:**
  - **Definition of "Unable to Maintain Themselves":** The Act doesn't provide a clear definition of what constitutes being "unable to maintain oneself." This ambiguity can lead to legal battles regarding the financial situation of both the parent and the child.
  - **Proof of Dependence:** The burden of proof lies with the elderly person to demonstrate their financial dependence on the child. Gathering evidence and presenting a strong case can be challenging, especially for those with cognitive decline.
  - **Transfer of Property:** While the Act protects against forced property transfers, it's difficult to prove undue influence in court.
  - **Low maintenance:** This act provides for the maximum limit of maintenance of Rs. 10,000 which is insufficient in the light of their advanced age and geriatric care which may require round the clock supervision.
  - **Unable to mention responsible persons:** The Act does not cover son in law or daughter in law within the definition of children thereby excluding them from the responsibility to maintain their in-laws relationships, though they may be the only earning members of the family.
  - **Negligence of government:** Act does not bind the State government in establishing old age homes or making the schemes for the functioning of old age homes.

Thus a lot of discussions happened. In turn, we got enlightened with her legal insight.

🚩 *Bianca Brijnath, University of Melbourne, Australia Director Social Gerontology, National Ageing Research Institute Honorary Professor, Melbourne School of Population and Global Health Adjunct Professor, School of Social Sciences, University of Western Australia:*

Having an another esteemed personality, Bianca Brijnath, we got the opportunity to gain a lot of informative resourceful perspectives regarding the topic “The Rights of Older people in World”.

### **Universal Rights:**

- **Human Rights Framework:** Older people are entitled to all fundamental human rights enshrined in international instruments like the Universal Declaration of Human Rights **Universal Declaration of Human Rights.**
- **Non-discrimination:** Discrimination based on age is a violation of these rights. Older people deserve equal access to opportunities and services.

***According to UNITED NATION HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION - “The power of the Universal Declaration is the power of ideas to change the world. It inspires us to continue working to ensure all people can gain freedom, equality and dignity.”***

The Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR) is a milestone document in the history of human rights. Drafted by representatives with different legal and cultural backgrounds from all regions of the world, it set out, for the first time, fundamental human rights to be universally protected.

- **Nonverbal Communication:** Maintain eye contact, use a calming tone of voice, and offer gentle physical touch if appropriate.
- **Patience and Empathy:** Be patient with slow responses and allow extra time for processing information. Show empathy and understanding.
- **Validation:** Acknowledge their emotions and feelings, even if they seem confused or illogical.
- **Focus on the Present:** Reminiscing about the past can be disorienting. Focus on present activities and routines.

**AQUAPHOBIA:** The sound of running water, combined with the tactile sensation of bathing, might be overwhelming for someone with dementia. Dementia can alter a person's perception of their surroundings. Water, especially clear or deep water, might appear unfamiliar or even threatening.

A combination of practical strategies can successfully manage dementia. It emphasizes the importance of:

- ❖ **Understanding the individual:** Identifying specific challenges and tailoring solutions accordingly.
- ❖ **Safety and Security:** Implementing measures to ensure the person with dementia's safety.
- ❖ **Promoting Independence:** Encouraging them to complete tasks independently as much as possible.
- ❖ **Maintaining Routine:** Providing a predictable daily routine to reduce anxiety and confusion.
- ❖ **Social Interaction:** Combatting social isolation by encouraging participation in social activities.
- ❖ **Communication and Patience:** Using clear communication and demonstrating patience to avoid frustration.

- ❖ **Seeking Support:** Utilizing resources like meal delivery services, memory cafes, and professional guidance when needed.

By implementing these strategies with compassion and understanding, caregivers can create a supportive environment that allows people with dementia to live a life with dignity and as much independence as possible.

### **Care Justice and Elder Care:**

Care justice, a feminist ethic, emphasizes the moral importance of caregiving and the ethical distribution of care work. Applying this lens to elder care exposes inequalities and challenges in our current systems.

- ❖ Gender: Women traditionally shoulder a larger burden of elder care, creating inequalities in career opportunities and personal well-being.
- ❖ Socioeconomic Status: Wealthier families can afford better elder care options, further marginalizing those with limited resources.
- ❖ Race and Ethnicity: Cultural norms and access to resources can impact the care received by elderly individuals.
- ❖ Immigration Status: Undocumented immigrants or those with limited English proficiency may face difficulties accessing elder care services.

### **Conundrums:**

- ❖ Balancing Work and Care: Supporting aging parents while managing careers and personal lives creates a significant challenge for many adults.
- ❖ Exploitation of Caregivers: Low wages and limited protections for professional caregivers raise ethical concerns.
- ❖ Technological Solutions: While technology can assist with elder care, overreliance can lead to social isolation and dehumanization.
- ❖ Open Communication: Encouraging open communication about end-of-life wishes and preferences can help families navigate difficult decisions.
- ❖ Further Considerations:
- ❖ Policy Changes: Advocacy for policies that support caregivers, such as paid family leave and affordable elder care options.
- ❖ Shifting Social Norms: Promoting a cultural shift that values caregiving and encourages men to share elder care responsibilities.

### **Conclusion:**

A care justice approach to elder care compels us to confront inequalities and build a future where everyone has access to dignified and ethical care in their later years. By acknowledging the

cleavages, addressing the conundrums, and working towards an ethical future, we can create a more just and supportive system for our aging population.

- ✓ **Silver Economy:** The growing elderly population creates a demand for goods and services specifically catering to their needs. This can create new job opportunities in healthcare, elder care, and leisure activities.
- ✓ **Flexible work arrangements:** Offering flexible work schedules or part-time options can enable older workers to continue contributing while managing health concerns or other commitments.
- ✓ **Leveraging Experience:** Companies can benefit from the experience and expertise of older workers by offering mentorship programs or phased retirement options.

She shared some beautiful stories. One of those is-

Her first *Spark of Life* Story begins with Sandip Ghosh, living with Alzheimer's disease. Sandip has lost his wife of four decades who was, quite simply, his strength and stayed all these years. Her death was sudden and was on his birthday. She had gone to the grocery to get some spices she needed to cook his favourite biryani, but was hit by a bus and never returned to him.

The death of a loved one is a blow at any time, but losing a spouse after many years of togetherness can be especially difficult and more so if one is experiencing the challenges of Alzheimer's at the same time.

He was mostly disconnected in the beginning after the loss. We know clearly how our emotional lives directly affect our hearts. **And, research says that the heart actually changes shape in response to sudden emotional disruption. In most cases, however, when the acute emotional stress disappears, the heart recovers and goes back to its normal shape.**

The emotional and physical support through positive connections that Sandip and Shrijani shared was the key to how well he coped. They mostly used their relationship to create experiences and activities that both enjoyed.

Instead of any explanations, **Shrijani, one of his closed ones, would just hug him or rest her head on his shoulder.**

This reality of now, the feeling of now, being cared for at that moment, was pure empathy.

**Dementia does not take away a person's wish to connect with other people. It is just their ability that is affected. So, if we talk to a person living with dementia and make them feel that their life is just as precious and valuable, and beautiful as ours, it can make a world of difference.**

- Good sources of omega-3s may include:
  - cold water fish, such as salmon, sardines, tuna, and mackerel, flaxseed, flaxseed oil, and chia seeds, nuts, such as walnuts and almonds.
- The quality of these foods can affect the levels of omega-3s they contain.
- Eating omega-3 fatty acids may increase the level of beneficial fats available to the brain, preserve the myelin sheath that protects nerve cells, and keep the brain working at the highest level. In turn, this can reduce the risk of mood disorders and brain diseases occurring.
